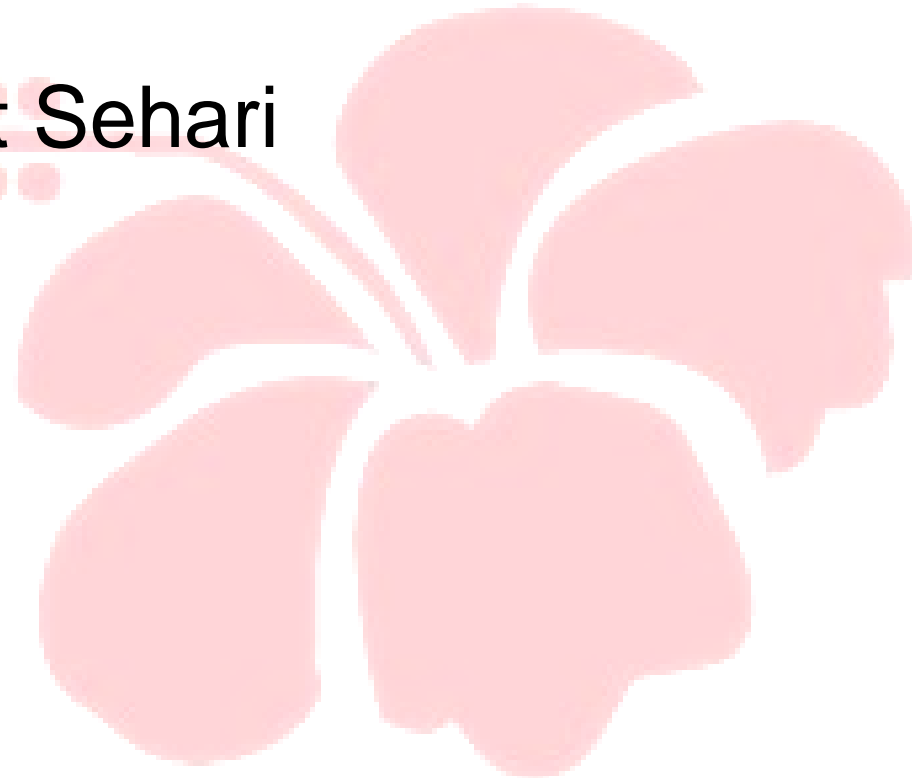

- Back in 1999, war raged in Kosovo leading to a storm of death and suffering. Moved by the plight of a countless number of innocent victims, our founder Tan Sri Jemilah Mahmood – a Malaysian obstetrician gynecologist – sought to offer her services voluntarily.

- Together with a handful of like-minded pioneers, she set up the Malaysian Medical Relief Society – better known today as MERCY Malaysia, a platform in which all Malaysians can unite and get involved in the international humanitarian arena.

- Today as a registered society of the Societies Act, we have more than 500 members supported by a proud circle of almost 5000 volunteers. Each who are ready to go out in the world and be an agent of hope wherever needed. It truly is a noble calling, one we are proud to be a part of.

### Disaster Risk Reduction

- Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) involves activities aimed at protecting communities from hazards and minimising their vulnerability to disaster risks. It moves beyond the traditional disaster management approach of simply focusing on response, rehabilitation and rebuilding after a disaster event.

## Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

- Since then, a range of safe water provision strategies were employed in operations in Johor and Pahang (2006 and 2007 floods, respectively), Pakistan (2005 South Asia earthquake), Indonesia (2006 Jogjakarta earthquake), Bangladesh (2007 cyclone), Myanmar (2008 Cyclone Nargis) and in ongoing conflicts in Sudan, Palestine and Sri Lanka
